

Diversified Cooperative Training

One-year program for seniors only offered at Mentor and Eastlake North

Here's a chance to get a head start by getting career training while still in high school. Diversified Cooperative Training (DCT) offers a chance to choose your own trade or occupation and receive career training on a part-time basis. Seniors spend a half-day in school studying both academics and other subjects related to on-the-job training.

What you'll learn:

Those occupations selected require at least 2,000 hours of activity, including the study of related information. Students are limited to training in only one occupation. The skilled trades listed on the back of the card are a sample of the types of occupations available for DCT applicants.
